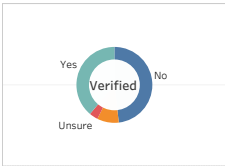
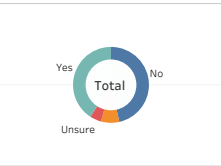


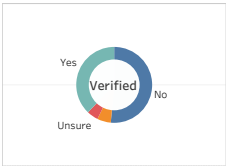
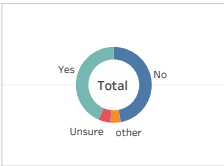
# Survey #13: CUSD Fiscal Stabilization Plan

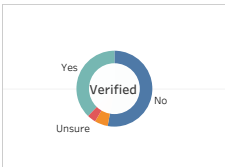
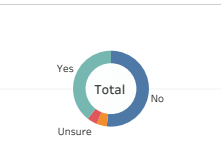

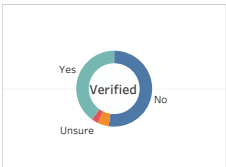
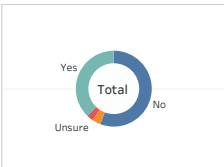
Question 2. Are you aware of the district's fiscal stabilization proposals, which include potential changes to middle school electives and the Transitional Kindergarten (TK) program?



Question 3. Are you aware that the proposals target \$4–5 million in combined savings from middle school electives and TK adjustments?



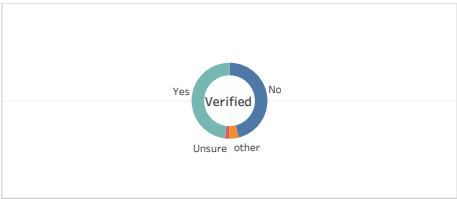
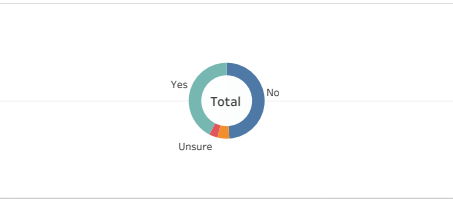
