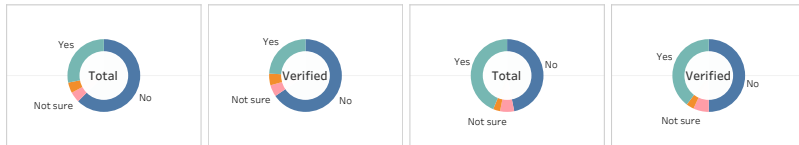


Survey #16: Your thoughts on the new California Math Framework

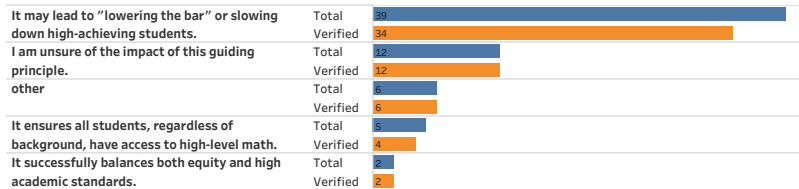

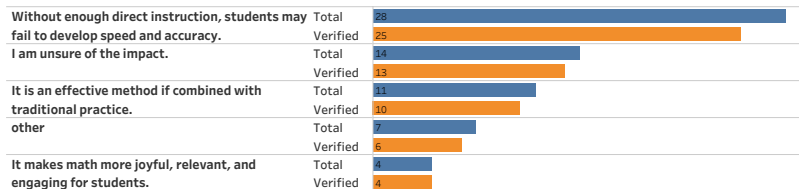
Question 2. Are you aware that the new Math Framework represents a significant shift away from traditional math instruction models?



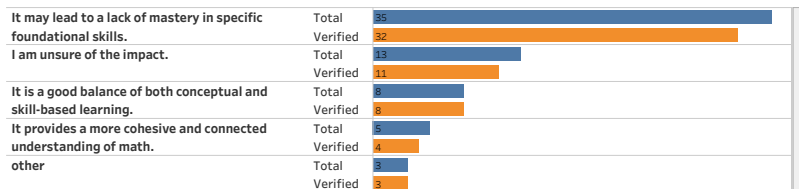
Question 3. The new Framework is centered on the dual goals of "Equity and Excellence." Which statement best reflects your view?



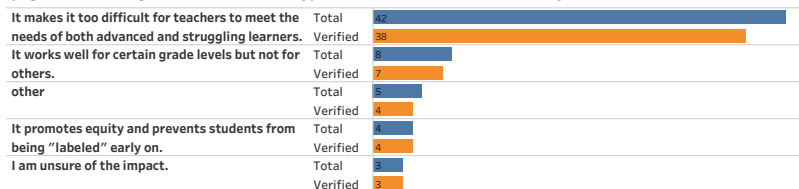
Question 4. The Framework shifts toward "Inquiry-Based" Learning (investigative problem-solving). Which statement best reflects your view?



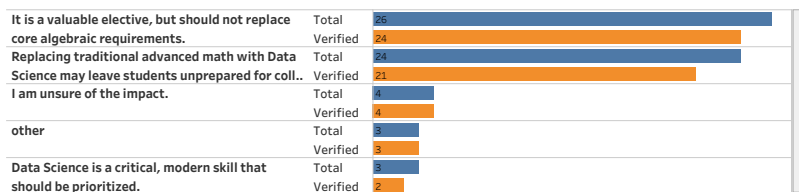
Question 5. The Framework organizes curriculum around "Big Ideas" to connect different math concepts. Which statement best reflects your view?
