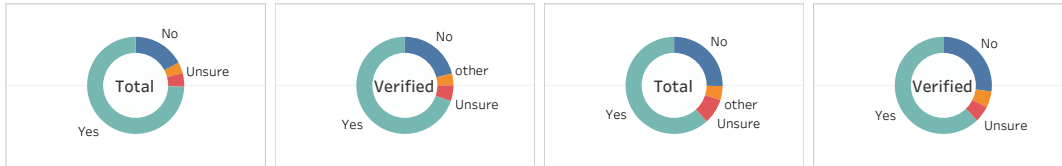


Survey #17: Your Input Needed: Proposed Changes to California's Equality Laws (ACA 7)

Verified voters: 74 (Total: 108) From 2026-03-30 to 2026-05-01

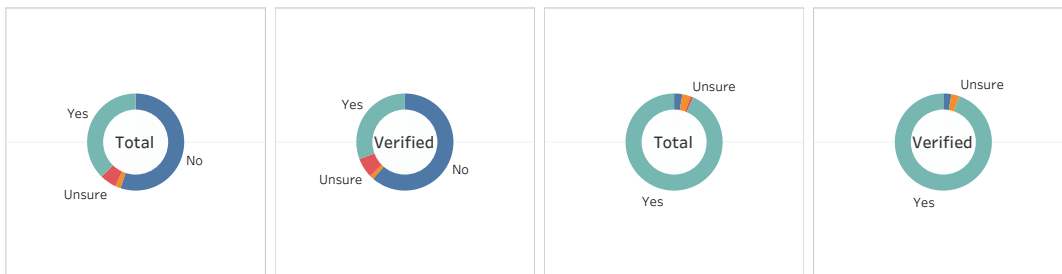
Question 1: Are you aware that the California Constitution currently prohibits school districts and government agencies from using race, gender, or ethnicity as a factor in admissions, hiring, or program placement?

Question 2: In 2020, California voters rejected Proposition 16, which would have repealed these prohibitions. Were you aware that voters recently reaffirmed this "equal treatment" principle?



Question 3: Are you aware that ACA 7 proposes to remove "public education" (K-12) from the constitutional ban on racial or gender preferences, and would allow these factors to be used in university-level resource allocation (excluding admissions)?

Question 5: CUSD currently provides need-based intervention programs in every school. Students receive extra help in subjects like math, reading, and writing based on their individual academic needs, regardless of race or gender. Do you support continuing these need-based programs?

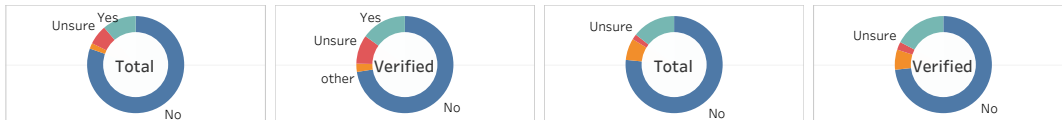


Question 4: Which of the following best reflects your view on how school districts should allocate resources or place students in programs (such as advanced math or specialized grants)?
