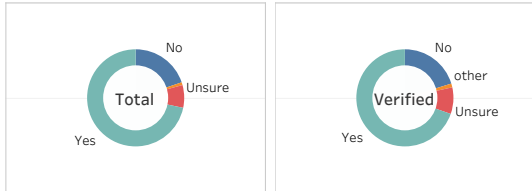


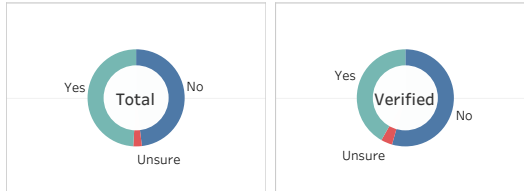
Survey #18: Should CUSD Follow LAUSD's New Classroom Screen Time Limits?

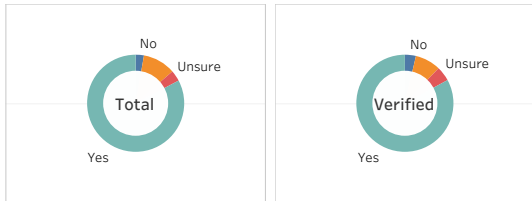

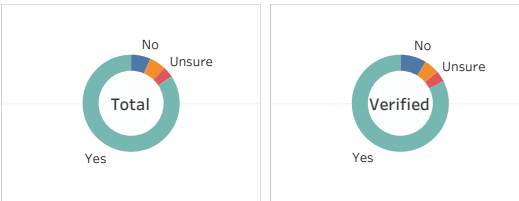

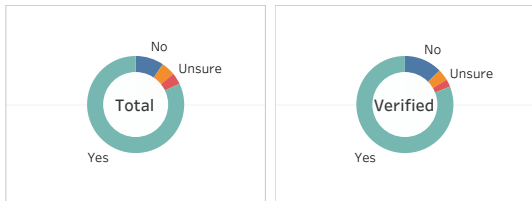

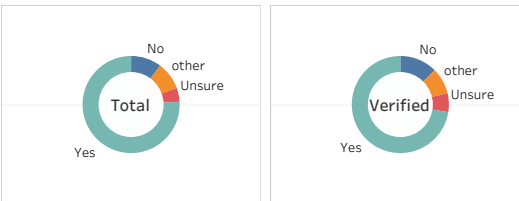

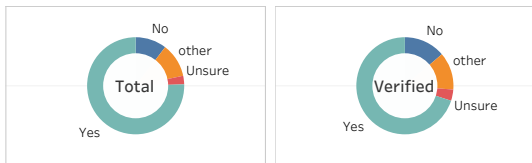
